In 2020 Marshall islands President David Kabua called for wealthy nations to pay for "loss and damage" to help ameliorate the effects of climate change on the Marshall Islands. The Marshall Islands have also called for a joint international effort to slow the rate of climate change, especially in regards to increasing sea levels. Following a drought in 2013, the US sent supplies to aid the Marshall Islands.

As a part of the shipping industry, Majuro Shipping Co Inc. operates within a sector that is increasingly focused on reducing carbon emissions and enhancing sustainability practices.

In recent years Majuro, the capital of the Marshall Islands, has become one of the world's leading transshipment ports for tuna. In 2022, 191 000 tonnes of skip jack tuna passed through this port.

At the summit the leaders of the Pacific Islands Forum nations recognised the need for strengthened national systems to plan for, access, deliver, absorb and monitor climate change and for donor countries to continue to simplify and harmonise their assessment, implementation and reporting processes for financing projec...
